Choose the projects you would like to complete! You must choose projects that add up to **at least 20 points.**

- o **Water Poem = 2 points** Write a poem using the following words: rain, snow, sleet, & hail.
- o **Water cycle Puzzle = 2 points** Create a crossword puzzle using 10 water cycle terms.
- o **Water cycle Puzzle= 2 points** Create a puzzle that shows the 3 main actions of water in the water cycle
- o **Water Journal = 4 points** Keep a water journal for a week. Collect data on 3 variables, then make a poster to display your data.
- o **Children's Story = 4 points** Write a children's story about the water in the summer in Rainier, WA; or in San Diego, CA
- o **Favorites = 4 points** Complete this statement using water cycle terms: I think _____ is more important than _____. Give 5 reasons to support your choice.
- o **Water Instrument = 6 points** Make a water instrument. Use the instrument to collect water data and make a data chart to record your measurements for two weeks.
- o **Meteorologists = 6 points** What does a meteorologist do in regard to water? What does a person have to do to become a meteorologist? Write a letter to a local meteorologist to find out. Use the information you receive to create an advertisement!
- o **Clean water = 8 points** Create two clean water posters to educate people about protecting the water in their area. Each poster must be on a different topic.
- o **Water Experiments = 8 points** Use the scientific method to answer these questions: Does water evaporate? Does water condense? Be sure to write a report detailing the steps in your experiment and the results. Make sure to correct write a hypothesis for each experiment you do.
- o **Water Cycle = 10 points** Create a mini water cycle using a 2-liter bottle, dirt, plants or seeds, & water. Keep a journal to record your observations for 12 days. For the first day, make a few predictions by about what it will look like in one week. one month, and one year?
