Vision and Hearing Screenings

Dear Parents,

Our School Nurse will be screening students for Vision and Hearing, starting with Kindergarten. During the Annual Student Update, parents were provided the opportunity to opt out of Vision and Hearing screening. Please contact the office if you have any questions.

Below is the information from the nurse:

What is a school hearing and vision screening?

<u>Washington State law (WAC 246-760)</u>¹ requires schools to conduct auditory and visual screenings of children each year. Students in grades K, 1, 2, 3, 5 and 7 are screened. If your child is not scheduled to be screened this year you may request a screening by contacting your school nurse. Inform them of any concerns you may have.

A school is not required to screen a student who has already had a comprehensive vision or hearing examination by a licensed care professional within the previous 12 months.

What happens at a hearing screening?

Hearing screening is done using equipment providing tonal stimuli at 1000, 2000 and 4000 hertz (Hz) at hearing levels of 20 decibels (dB) to each ear, in a quiet room. Students who do not pass the initial hearing test are then scheduled to be re-screened. Parent/guardians are notified if their child does not pass the second screening.
