Highly Capable Program Parent Referral Information 6-12

The Rainier School District offers services to students who have been identified as highly capable. Highly capable students are those who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels. Nominations are accepted for students in grades K - 12 who are not already enrolled in the highly capable program and may be made by the student's parents, teachers, or school district staff. Services are provided for students in grades K - 12 including advanced reading or math groups at the elementary level, and honors, advanced placement, and college in the high school options for middle and high school students.

A holistic screening process will be conducted on all referrals. This process considers a child's complete academic history including standardized test results, parent input, teacher evaluation, and CogAT screening. Full CogAT online assessments are administered by trained RSD staff. Parents/guardians will be notified of the results of this process during the week of March 28th via email.

If you would like to refer your student, please complete the nomination form below and the Parent Rating Scale. Return both forms to your school's main office no later than **February 28, 2023**. There are no extensions to this deadline.
