Approaching Goals - Nutrition and food service operation will continue to encourage students to participate in the School Meals Program. At the Elementary School. We will continue to promote healthy choice.

Meeting Goals - The District continues to communicate to the community and families pricing and healthy eating within the schools thru emails, newsletters and Social Media notifications.

Needs Work – Health and Physical Education Program Physical Activity - Has been given to the Supt to review with admin and PE Teachers to confirm and assess policy is in compliance. Rainier School District Wellness committee will be reinstated to include teachers, community members, students and staff to meet annually.

Continued Work – Ensure within each school building that meal periods are in compliance to USDA and revisit Meal Charging Policy and update if necessary-.

Revision Recommendation

Add to Procedure:

6700P

Community Eligibility Provision

Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, each school with an Identified Student Percentage (ISP) of at least 40% shall operate the USDA Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) and offer meals at no cost to all students.

The Identified Student Percentage (ISP) is calculated by dividing the number of Identified Students, students categorically eligible for free school meals by direct certification or other purposes, by the total enrollment.

Breakfast After the Bell

Each year the district will determine if any schools become a High-Needs School and implement an appropriate Breakfast after the Bell program in accordance with state and federal program requirements.
