



Message from the School Nurse

Dear Parent or Guardian,

Starting August 1, 2020, all immunization records turned into schools are required by state law to be medically verified. Immunizations records must be turned into the school on or before the first day of attendance. This means immunization records must be from a health care provider or you must attach paperwork from a health care provider to your handwritten form that shows your child's records are accurate. Your child cannot attend school until you provide these records.

Here are some examples of medically verified immunization records:

- A. A completed Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) signed by a health care provider. Find the CIS form by visiting https://www.doh.wa.gov/SCCI and clicking on "Certificate of Immunization Status".
 - B. A CIS filled out by you or another parent/guardian with medical records attached.
 - C. A CIS printed by health care provider or school from Washington State Immunization Information System.
- D. A CIS printed from MyIR which is a free Department of Health online tool that allows families to view and print their official immunization records themselves. Go to https://wa.myir.net/register to begin the sign up process

If you are requesting an exemption from one or more of the immunization requirements, you must provide the school a completed Certificate of Exemption.

If your child already meets immunization requirements and has records on file with the school, you do not need to do anything. If you aren't sure or if you have any questions please contact Nurse Heidi at your child's school.

Child Find

Rainier School District is committed to addressing the unique needs of students with disabilities ages Birth through 21 residing within the boundaries of the Rainier School District. This includes children with disabilities enrolled in private, including religious schools, as well as children who are homeless (if your family is living in a temporary situation, you may contact the district where you are currently staying for a screening). Disabilities can be in any one of several areas that ultimately affect a child's learning, such as the ability to think, to express oneself, to see or hear clearly, to get around or understand instructions given.

Birth to 5 children have access to free developmental assessment. Areas could include:

approaches to learning physical/motor

social/emotional

cognitive

communication and language

literacy

math/numeracy

sensory function

temperament

behavior

specific disabilities such as autism

If you have a child who you think might have a disability requiring special education instruction or significant accommodations at school or if you know of such a child, please feel free to contact the Rainier School District Special Education Office at 360-446-7406 ext 1210 or P.O. Food Service

The goal of the School Breakfast and Lunch Program is to provide nutritious meals to children during the school day. Children may receive breakfast and lunch at no cost to them if they are categorically eligible for free meals or if they qualify for free meals based on Federal poverty guidelines. Sometime, however, children who do not qualify based on these standards would like a breakfast or lunch, but do not have money in their account or in-hand to cover the cost of the meal at the time of meal service.

Rainier School District recognizes that unpaid meal charges represent a difficult and complex issue directly impacting the school, as well as the children they serve. We are sensitive to this fact. **However, now that we are at the end of the school year, the school district must balance our school food service operations.** Please make sure your student (s) lunch accounts are paid in full. Money can be added to a child's meal account by using a credit card online at: www.rainier.wednet.edu
