1. Proof of residency
2. A copy of your child's birth certificate or other proof of age/guardianship
3. Immunization records
4. A completed Kindergarten Google Registration Form must be submitted online
5. Skyward Annual Update

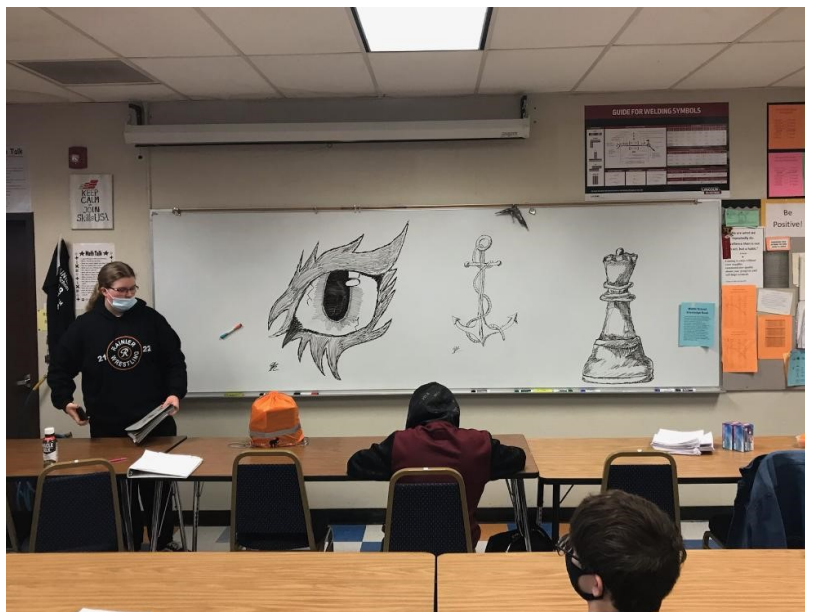

CTE Celebration Month

CTE Month is a public awareness national campaign held each **February** to celebrate Career and Technical Education (CTE) and the achievements and accomplishments of technical programs and students across the country from K-12 through college and beyond.

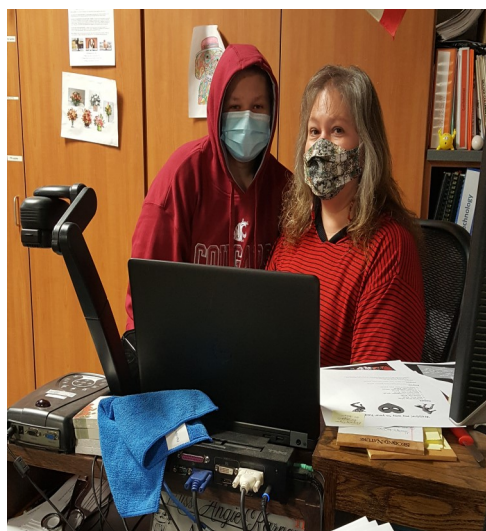
Career and Technical Education (CTE) bridges the gap between high school and postsecondary plans. CTE programs include career skills training that helps students become ready for college or work. CTE curriculum focuses on academic, employability, and technical skills used in a specific occupation.

Career and technical education (CTE) is the **practice of teaching specific career skills** to students in middle school, high school, and post-secondary institutions. Because CTE programs put an emphasis on career-readiness, they **teach important employability skills** that are currently in high demand. According to a Cengage survey, “soft skills” such as attention to detail, effective communication and critical thinking are the most in-demand skills in today's job market.

CTE is split into 16 career clusters that apply to different high-demand careers. Here in Rainier we offer courses within 5 programs. Agriculture and FFA by Angie Karnes, Business and FBLA taught by Sandy Rossmair, Family and Consumer/Health Sciences and Interact Club by Michele Baker, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and TSA by Adam Cornwall, Architecture & Construction/Manufacturing and SkillsUSA led by John Lybecker. Each of these programs have a Career and Technical Student Organization for extending classroom learning into the real world.
