

Rainier FFA Landscape

Rainier FFA Landscape students want to **THANK** the Rainier community for coming out and supporting our growing efforts this year at our plant sale. We were able to almost sell out and we had our largest inventory ever.

Students started seeds and plugs from early January through March and did an amazing job finishing their crops for our annual plant sale.

The sales over the past 3 years has made enough for us to order tables for our taller greenhouse and to replace the wood tables we built 28 years ago in our short greenhouse.

The process of growing flower crops for this plant sale teaches students about soils, pests, using integrated pest management systems without any synthetic pesticides or herbicides. Focusing more on cleanliness and beneficial insects. We do use fertilizer in the last month of growing to teach about plant nutrient needs and to make sure all seedlings and plugs have strong root systems, lots of green foliage and flowering. Students also learn lots of new plants to add to their plant identification and the differences between annuals, perennials, herbs and much more.

They also learn about the business side of such a large project, with inventories, cost of goods needed, online sales and order filling, in-person sales and customer service as well as marketing and clean-up. Many employability skills and good work ethic come from classroom teaching then experiential learning on site. Our community support of programs like these are a great way to help our high school students develop skills needed to give them a "leg up" in the job market and a successful experience working with others.
