Please pre-register online: http://www.rainier.wednet.edu/domain/60 and fill out the Pre-Registration Google Form. We will contact you to confirm your interest in our kindergarten program and to review our registration process. You will also receive an email with the information for the next step.

To complete your child's registration:

- 1. Proof of residency!
- 2. A copy of your child's birth certificate or other proof of age/guardianship.
- 3. Immunization records, must be complete before attending school.
- 4. A completed Kindergarten Google Registration Form submitted online, link will be emailed after **step two** is completed.
- 5. Skyward Annual Update, information will be emailed after the enrollment form is completed.

Rainier School District is committed to addressing the unique needs of students with disabilities ages Birth through 21 residing within the boundaries of the Rainier School District. This includes children with disabilities enrolled in private, including religious schools, as well as children who are homeless (if your family is living in a temporary situation, you may contact the district where you are currently staying for a screening). Disabilities can be in any one of several areas that ultimately affect a child's learning, such as the ability to think, to express oneself, to see or hear clearly, to get around or understand instructions given.

Birth to 5 children have access to free developmental assessment. Areas could include:

approaches to learning physical/motor social/emotional cognitive

communication and language

literacy math/numeracy sensory function temperament behavior

specific disabilities such as autism

If you have a child who you think might have a disability requiring special education instruction or significant accommodations at school or if you know of such a child, please feel free to contact the Rainier School District Special Education Office at 360-446-7406 ext 1210 or P.O. 
Pickleball Clinic

Rainier Wrestling Finishes Another Great Season!

The wrestling season concluded Saturday, February 17, in the Tacoma Dome for the Rainier team that sent 8 boys and 4 girls to the state tournament.

Leading the way was Rainier Junior Zander Peck (43-4) who won the regional championship at 157 pounds.

Joining Peck on the road to the Dome was Ryder Cruse (285) 4th at regionals, Matthew Kenney (215) 2nd at regionals, Blake Roberts (215) 4th at regionals, Dorien Cano (165) 3rd at regionals, Rudy Garcia (157) 5th at regionals, Connor Power (150) 6th at regionals and Jacob Scott (106) 3rd at regionals.


The girls sent three competitors to the Dome and one alternate. Emma Desotell (110), Kiera Anderson (170) and Katherine Kinahan (190) all placed 2nd at regionals. Ryleigh Cruse (235) placed 4th at regionals making her the alternate at her weight.

Peck earned a 2nd place medal at Mat Classic XXXV after reaching the finals receiving a bye followed by two straight wins. Peck was joined on the podium by Matthew Kenney (215) who placed 4th and Ryder Cruse (285) who placed 6th. The Rainier Mountaineers placed 6th overall as a team with 66 points. This is the highest team placing since 2001 when the team placed 5th.

The Rainier Lady Mountaineers came home with some hardware as well. Katherine Kinahan (190) placed 4th making her the highest placing Lady Mountaineer in school history. Keira Anderson (170) brought home a 6th place medal overcoming a knee injury midway through the tournament. The team placed 19th out of 68 schools. All but two of the schools ahead of them were 1A or 2A schools.

Connor Power (150) was named the Academic State Champion for his weight class for the 1B/2B schools with a cumulative GPA of 3.800. Annabelle Whiteman (135) was also crowned Academic State Champion for her weight class for the 1B/2B/1A/2A Girls with a cumulative GPA 3.858. Matthew Kenney (215), Zander Peck (157) and Keira Anderson (170) were Honorable Mention All State Academic team.

It was a very successful season for the Mountaineers that saw tremendous growth with the largest boys team (24) and largest girls team (21) in recent memory. Not only was there growth and improvement on the mat, there was also growth within the individuals participating as they each became better people. The 2024-25 season is looking to be a good one.




